

ORDINANCE NO. 1987-4

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS
OF STOP SIGNS PLACED IN THE TOWN OF BROOKLAND, ARKANSAS
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Brookland,
Arkansas:

Section 1: For all stop signs placed pursuant to any Ordinance of this Town Council previously passed or hereafter passed, any person who shall the violate instructions on the face of any of the signs shall be deemed to have violated this ordinance when such signs are placed at the intersections denominated by ordinance of this Town Council.

Section 2: Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this ordinance or who shall have been determined to have violated any stop sign placed pursuant to ordinance of this Town Council either before this date or hereafter shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00.

Section 3: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4: It is found and declared by the Town Council of the Town of Brookland, Arkansas that traffic is increasing at such a rate that proper traffic control must be maintained and provisions for violations of all ordinances relating to stop signs are needed and are necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, so that an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
