ORDINANCE NO. 2001-1

**ORDINANCE APPROVING TWO WAY STOP AT OAK & SCHOOL ST.
THE CITY OF BROOKLAND, ARKANSAS**

Whereas the stop signs on the east and west side of the intersection of School Street at Oak Street are causing a traffic congestion; and

Whereas the removal of same appears to be in the best interest of the city; now therefore,

Be it ordained as follows:

- 1) The stop signs controlling the east-west flow of traffic on School Street at the intersection of Oak Street shall be removed.
- 2) Emergency clause. Due to the continuous congestion of traffic an undue restriction of the flow of traffic at peak times creates a safety hazard to the populace of the community, it is hereby declared that an emergency exists, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
