WHEREAS, Arbor Day is celebrated throughout the world and nationally to encourage Americans to maintain and replenish our country's forests and woodlands, and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce erosion, provide stability for our ecosystem and supply habitat for wildlife, and

WHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource providing paper, wood for construction, fuel for fires and countless other wood products, and

WHEREAS, trees in our city provide shade and beautify homes, neighborhoods and parks in the community,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kenneth D. Jones, Mayor of the City of Brookland, Arkansas, do hereby proclaim March 11, 2011 as
