RESOLUTION 2003-13

It is hereby resolved by the City Council of Brookland, Arkansas that the Policy for Out of Jurisdiction Law Enforcement Activities shall be that:

When an Officer is requested or wishes to exercise arrest powers outside of their normal jurisdiction, Arkansas Code 16-81-106 (4), requires that said Officer have permission of the County law enforcement agency having jurisdiction in the locale where the Officer is assisting or working by request. The Officer's home agency is required to have on file a written policy regulating the law enforcement activities undertaken by such personnel. This Policy is therefore intended to comply with the provisions of Arkansas Code 16-81-106 (4).

Officers working in another jurisdiction shall:

- 1) Have permission in writing from the jurisdiction to perform law enforcement services and activities within the relevant jurisdiction. A copy must be filed with the Craighead County Sheriff's Office.
- 2) Have permission from the Craighead County Sheriff's Office to perform such out of jurisdiction law enforcement activities. Such permission may be general or may be limited to specific operations or activities. In this case, they will remain general unless specified by the Craighead County Sheriff's Office. Operational activities and administrative over-site will remain the responsibility of the Craighead County Sheriff's Office.
- 3) No pay, seniority or other benefits will accrue to Officers from the outside jurisdiction. As a result of service to said jurisdiction, liability, insurance, wages and expenses for the Officers and their equipment will remain with the jurisdiction owning such equipment or employing such personnel. The outside jurisdiction may, upon legislative action by a municipal or county government, establish separate compensation, expenses, or benefits for outside personnel if they so desire.
- 4) The Craighead County Sheriff may, at any time, limit or withdraw the services of municipal personnel to an outside jurisdiction upon notice to said jurisdiction.
- 5) This Policy is not intended to supersede existing court holdings or statutory authority allowing out of jurisdictional activities by law enforcement personnel such as, but not limited to, other related pre-existing legal provisions.
