From the Mayor's Desk: Brookland 2018. What is ahead for us as a city? If you talk to developers, the sky is the limit. If you listen to the citizens of Brookland, they also think there is a great opportunity for our city's future. We the administrators of aovernment and citv employees all agree the future opportunities for our city are great. With growth opportunity. Let's look at the proposed Haag Brown project at School Street and Hwy 49. One of the most requested developments is a grocery store. Not only will this proposed development have a grocery store it will have a bank, restaurants, etc. The City of Brookland supports this development. proposed Brookland currently has five subdivisions being built. Brookland Hills is working on the third phase; Whispering Hills phase one is complete and construction of homes has started; Heritage Trace, the Planned Unit Development, is completion; nearing Cameron Place, and Brookvale Subdivision are still in the preconstruction phases.

The city has purchased 307 N Bernis and 202 Smith Street. The house at 307 N Bernis will be removed and the lot will be subdivided by the city. Two lots will be sold as residential, and a retention pond will be built on the remainder of land for the area. The property at 202 Smith Street is approximately 2.4 acres and will be home to the new Brookland City Park. The current park, located

behind 309 N. Bernis, will be moved to 202 Smith Street. Land at the current park will be subdivided and sold as R-1 for single family homes. The water improvement project is moving forward. The new well has been drilled and installed, the 400,000-gallon water storage tank has been finished, water line improvement project is proceeding, and new well house is started. The new well scheduled to be on line in February. We want to thank everyone for their patience as construction of these projects near completion. There is still a lot of work to be done on water line work throughout our city. Once these lines have been charged, tested, and approved by the Arkansas Health Department residences will start being moved to the new main. Yards that have been disturbed where work has been done, will be leveled and cleaned up. The contractor who is doing the work will strive to get them back to preconstruction stage.

Street widening projects currently being worked on is Stevens and W. Matthews. Several other street projects are scheduled for 2018.

I just want to remind everyone that leaving trash carts out by city streets is breaking a city ordinance. The problem is created when cars meet on city streets and one of these trash cans is hit by a vehicle and causes damage. Are you aware if you leave a trash can on the side of a city street and a car hits it or it causes a wreck, you the home

owner/renter could be held responsible?

Brookland School's new sports arena opened this fall. If you have not had the opportunity to go watch a basketball game, I suggest you do. What a great addition to Brookland School.

The sidewalk between Brookland Elementary and Brookland Middle School is scheduled to start as soon as the temperature will allow.

It has been COLD! Just want to remind you to leave your cabinet doors open not only in your kitchen, but on your bathroom vanities as well. Put insulated covers over your outside faucets and insulate your pipes. I even leave each faucet in my home on with a drip. This might just stop my water pipes from freezing saving me a plumber's fee. Let's remember to check on our elderly citizens and neighbors throughout this cold weather season, remember your outside pets have plenty of warm bedding and fresh water daily.


