From the Mayor's Desk:

I hope everyone had a great New Year. As we say goodbye to 2018 and look to 2019 we have several things to give our thanks for. Our city is growing, school is growing, new homes are being built, new bank is coming to city, and several businesses are looking at us as well. Things are looking very good for our future. Our 4.7-million-dollar water project is 90% complete. We are now upgrading main water lines to the outer areas. This includes new main lines south to Crain road along HWY 49, north to city limits along west side of HWY 49, east to city limits along East School Street, and many others. HWY 49 and School Street intersection turn lanes on east and west bound lanes are a priority for 2019. We have it listed on the North East Arkansas Transportation board priority list for their next TIP money. However, it will be 2023 before this funding becomes available. As our community grows, our school district grows, the issue at this intersection will continue to be a major issue. What I have asked the city council to consider, is a Franchise Tax Bond. This is done by ordinance that dedicates a percentage of the current franchise tax to make the bond payment. We will keep you posted on this issue. At School Street and Holman (HWY49B) we are looking into some pedestrian crosswalk lights. It will be activated by a pedestrian pushing a button that triggers the light. AR-DOT will have to approve the lights we choose before they can be installed.

Drainage will continue to be a work in process. We will finish our retention pond and ditch clean out at 307 N. Bernis. The new culvert installation on W. Matthews will be completed on north side. Northern Heights subdivision ditch work will start in 2019. This will be done in three phases. Phase one will be from HWY 49 to Christy. Phase two will be from Christy to Teresa. Phase three will be from Teresa to Janis. Engineers are working on drawings. When completed, this drainage ditch will work in conjunction with the school detention ponds and the detention ponds at E. School and Holman.

Work will continue along Stevens Street, East and West Matthews, Eason Street from East Hinkley to Maple Slough Ditch for future widening of these roads. Drainage ditches along Brooks Street are in the planning stage. State aid funding in the amount of \$250,000.00 dollars overlaid Hayes Street, Eason Street from Maple Slough Ditch to Three Notch Road, and Whitten Creek Road from E School Street to Stevens Street. We will apply again for this funding in 2020.

The library project is moving forward, and you should see work beginning at 401 Holman soon. Plan is to get library up and running, then start on museum side. If you pass by the stores, day or night, you can see the 1941 Chevrolet Fire truck owned by the City of Brookland sitting inside. This was the city's first fire truck and it will be on display in the museum. We will be looking for volunteers to help with these projects in the future.

The Storm Shelter at 407 Holman is ready for use. Though it is not painted on the outside, the structure is ready. The multi complex room on the west end of the storm shelter is being remodeled. Once complete, it will be available to rent by citizens of the city for use.

Plans are in the preliminary stage for the lots between the library/museum and the storm shelter/multi-complex buildings, to utilize the area for a Brookland City Veterans Memorial. Brookland City Council recently formed a Veterans Memorial Committee and will ask them to look at this area. As the committee meets and presents ideas, we will keep you posted. Watch the website for future announcements. I want everyone to remember our veterans past and present, and say a prayer for them and their families as well as those actively serving in the military.

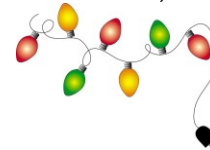
Motor Cycle/ATV: 1st Place - Fisher / Weaver families; 2nd Place - Keith Cooper; 3rd Place - Larry Davis.
