From the Mayor's Desk:

Happy New Year to everyone. I hope you and our city have a Blessed 2017. As we close the book on 2016, we look back and can see some accomplishments, but also see more things that need to be done to make our city a better place for all.

Storm water drainage on Holman (HWY49B) and Union Pacific Railroad on East School Street has improved. We have had two rain events recently that would have normally put that section of School Street under water. Water that would have flowed down Brooks Street and across yards, stayed in the ditch and detention pond banks. Underground culverts, when completed will allow us to widen East School Street between Holman and UP railroad, while straightening the School Street intersection so it is not offset. The crosswalk at this intersection has been moved to the north side of the intersection, allowing better visibility by motorist of children who are crossing the intersection.

We are trying to start cleaning other city ditches out but need your help. We have sent or will be sending out Right-of-Way requests along these drainage ditches. ROW just gives the city the right to clean ditches out and keep these ditches clean in the future.

We applied for and was awarded a grant that will build a new sidewalk from Brookland Police Station at 409 Holman north to School Street in 2017. We were also awarded a grant that will build a sidewalk from Brookland Elementary to the new Brookland Middle School. This project should start first part of

2017. Plans are to apply for a new grant for sidewalks that will aid in the replacement of all the old sidewalks on the west and east side of our city. I will keep you informed on this grant in the future.

The sewer extension project in the Gambill Subdivision has started. Scheduled date of completion is the middle of February, weather permitting. Sewer lines will be stubbed out to the property. There will be a \$45.00 inspection fee by the city. The owner will be responsible for running sewer line from their home to the stub out. Sealed bids were received for the Water Improvement project. The bids for the line work went to Rainwater Construction Company, LLC Jonesboro, Arkansas; well house and well went to Carl Baldwin Construction, Wynne, Arkansas. The 400,000-gallon water storage tank has been bid but after review by Civil Engineers, it was found that the bids were not done to specifications. We are looking further into this issue, but we may have to re-bid the water storage tank. Work will begin when we get final approval of plans from Arkansas Department of Health.

The Brookland Senior Citizen Helping Hand Committee was formed and will hold their first meeting on January 5, 2017 at 7 pm in the meeting room located at city hall (613 Holman). Our goal is to offer assistance to the elderly citizens in the city that need help with projects they cannot do themselves. The first

meeting will establish the positions of chairman, co-chairman and recorder. The committee will then set their bylaws of how they operate. Various church, school and civic groups have volunteered to help with this program, so once application is made, BSCHHC will contact those groups of volunteers so they can assist with the projects.

We look forward to the new year for Brookland. We have been truly blessed. I hope everyone has a Blessed and Safe 2017.

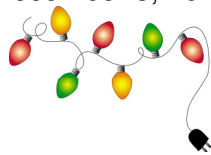
